PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Widowed parents face unique and often overwhelming challenges as they cope the loss of a spouse/partner, while helping their children grieve and adapting to life as a sole parent. Dr. Yopp co-leads the Widowed Parent Program at the University of North Carolina, which exists to support and learn about this subset of the grieving population that has been overlooked and underserved. Dr. Yopp, who also authored *The Group: Seven Widowed Fathers Reimagine Life* (Oxford University Press), will present on recent research efforts to learn about these bereaved families and on clinical efforts designed specifically to support widowed parents. This is a 90-minute webinar presentation. This program is valid for 1.5 hours of CE credit for a wide variety of professional boards.
