
PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

In the United States, elderly persons aged 65 and older make up 13% of the population but accounted for 18% of all suicides. Dr. Stallion will examine trends and hallmarks of elderly suicide and suggest approaches for dealing with suicidal elders and their surviving family and friends.

Judith M. Stillion, PhD, CT is Professor Emerita of psychology and currently serves as a consultant on a variety of issues including end-of-life issues, meaningful aging, positive psychology applied to grieving and dying, strategic planning and facilitation of grief groups. Dr. Stillion's varied career includes teaching and counseling in the public schools and at the university level. She began teaching the psychology of death and dying in 1975 and continued for over 20 years. She also served as Associate and Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs at Western Carolina University, USA Associate Vice-President for Academic Affairs in the University of North Carolina System and founding Director of the Institute for Leadership, Ethics & Character at Kennesaw State University. She has written three books and numerous chapters and articles in her field of expertise.
