In the United States, elderly persons aged 65 and older make up 13% of the population but accounted for 18% of all suicides. Dr. Stallion will examine trends and hallmarks of elderly suicide and suggest approaches for dealing with suicidal elders and their surviving family and friends.

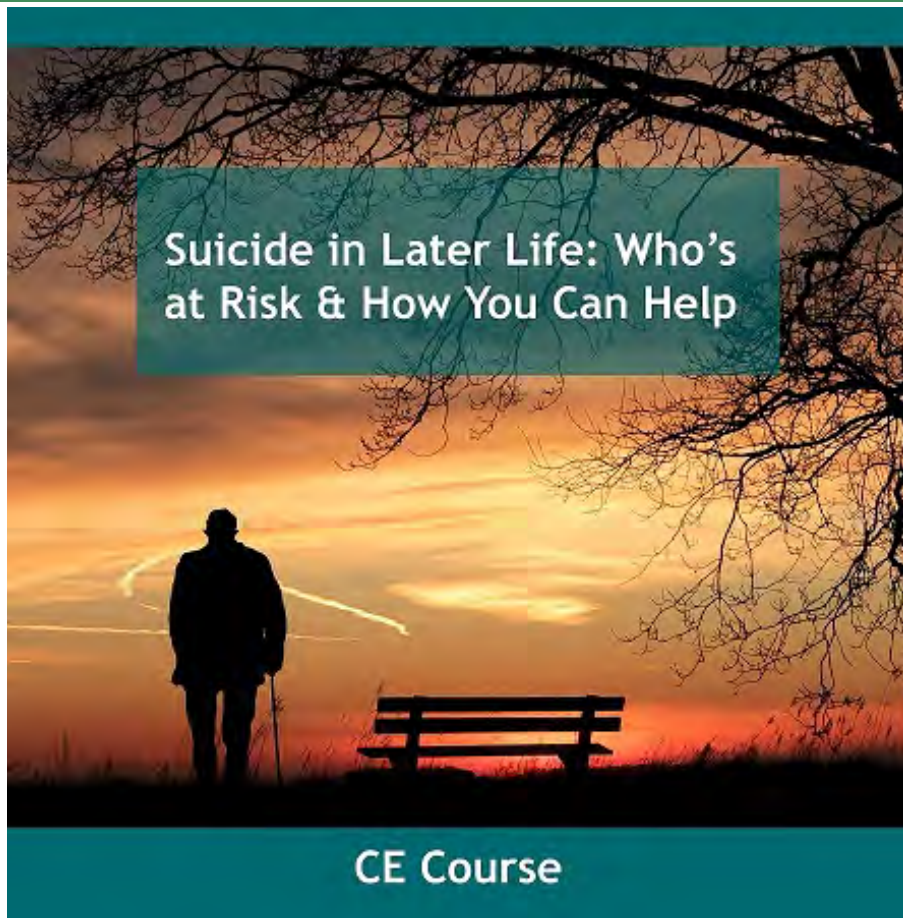
